- Banner and logo for 2010, <u>all day at different events</u> was <u>discussed</u>; Messages shared <u>described</u> 2010 and <u>the run</u>

- World Heritage sites, include Banks of Danube and Buda Castle
- Painter, <u>vészabó\_noémi</u>, honorary adjudicator beautiful letter,: "children know the secret, they dare to believe

Mayor Cox read out a wonderful proclamation.




Children showed much eagerness to participate in the days program.

# **Oneness Family School and Peace Academy**




One of the major highlights of the World Harmony Run in the USA, especially at the very beginning, is being hosted by the Oneness-Family School and Peace



#### Hungary – (continued) The Plaza and Stage now were alive with activity!




Ashrita Furman, who holds the World Record for the most Guinness World Records, was also in Budapest for this event.

The team was warmly welcomed in **Göstling** by the friendly Mayor and people from the community - among them, famous **alpine ski champion**, **Kathrin Zettel**.








