### Running Around the World to Meet / A Group Visits Schools

At Ofuna Elementary School, Kamakura

The team of World Harmony Run came to Ofuna Elementary School (Principal Akio Yamaguchi) in Kamakura on the 2nd. They met with the 61 fourth graders (see photo). It is a running event which relays a torch, aiming for harmony that transcends national borders and ego.

The team consisted of 11 men and women, including members from overseas. When they asked the children which countries those foreign nationals came from, the first hint was "We come from a country of vast steppes (prairies)," to which the children loudly responded, "Mongolia." As soon as the other one showed his national flag, a child immediately answered, "Czech," at which the Czech member himself was surprised. The children said the motto: "Harmony begins with me" out loud in languages of the members, sang a song, and ran. The team will continue and visit preschools and elementary schools in the city by a relay on the 3rd.
